## PETITIONERS' STATEMENT OF ISSUES TO BE RAISED

- 1. Whether the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has the legal authority under 42 U.S.C. § 7521(a) to issue standards that involve greenhouse gas credit trading—either between manufacturers and/or within a manufacturer's fleet—and that involve bonus credits for electric vehicles, rather than a maximum emission standard for a class or classes of new motor vehicles or new motor vehicle engines.
- 2. Whether the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency arbitrarily and capriciously failed to consider reasonable alternatives that were less stringent than the California Framework.
